It has come to the notice of the Medical Council of India (MCI) that a number of candidates who have done their 10+2 from National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) or State Open Schools and desire to take admission in MBBS or equivalent medical course in a medical university outside the country in the academic year 2017-18, are approaching the Council for Eligibility Certificate.

In this context, all the concerned persons are hereby informed that the requirement of obtaining Eligibility Certificate to pursue Primary Medical Qualification (MBBS or its equivalent) by an Indian Citizen/Oversees Citizen of India is mandatory in terms of section 13(4B) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and as per the eligibility criteria as laid down in the prevailing MCI Regulations namely "Eligibility Requirement for Taking Admission in an undergraduate medical course in a Foreign Medical Institution Regulation, 2002" no candidate shall be allowed to be admitted to the MBBS or equivalent medical course unless:-

- 1. He/she shall complete the age of 17 years on or before 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of admission to such course.
  - 2. He/She has passed qualifying examination as under:
    - a. The higher secondary examination or the Indian School Certificate Examination which is equivalent to 10+2 Higher Secondary Examination after a period of 12 years study, the last two years of study comprising of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Biotechnology and Mathematics or any other elective subjects with English at a level not less than core course of English as prescribed by the National Council of Educational Research and Training after the introduction of the 10+2+3 years educational structure as recommended by the National Committee on education;
